PRESS RELEASE - March 15, 2017

1. **Wayward Juvenile - Simple Assault/Battery & Disorderly Conduct:** On Thursday, March 9, 2017, at 8:30 AM, School Resource Officer Adam Andrukiewicz arrested a **15-year-old male student** at the Chariho RYSE Program on charges of (1) **Simple Assault/Battery** and (2) **Disorderly Conduct** after the youth pushed and then punched a male teacher who had verbally reprimanded the youth for disrupting class. The youth was returned to the station where he was subsequently released to his mother. The youth shall be petitioned into Family Court on the above charges.
2. **FELONY - Possession of a Controlled Substance (Cocaine & Adderall):** On Saturday, March 11, 2017 at approximately 8:09 PM, Patrolman Michael Jacome and Corporal William Litterio arrested **Jennifer Cedona**, age 29, of 7 Bodell Avenue, Providence on charges of (1) **Possession of a Controlled Substance (Cocaine)** and (2) **Possession of a Controlled Substance (1-pill of Adderall)** after Patrolman Jacome stopped her unregistered vehicle on Route 95 Northbound in Richmond led to the discovery of a small amount of cocaine and a pill for which she had no prescription. Ms. Cedona was processed at the station, and was arraigned before Justice of the Peace Joseph Scott. She was subsequently released on personal recognizance.
3. **FELONY - Possession of a Controlled Substance (Clonazepam):** On Saturday, March 11, 2017 at approximately 8:09 PM, Patrolman Michael Jacome and Corporal William Litterio arrested **Aisha Wilcox**, age 31 of 42 Washington Street, Providence on a charge of **Possession of a Controlled Substance (Clonazepam)** after Patrolman Jacome stopped an unregistered vehicle on Route 95 Northbound in Richmond which led to the discovery of 14 ½ pills of the above substance in a prescription bottle bearing the name of a person who was not in the vehicle. Ms. Wilcox was processed at the station, and was arraigned before Justice of the Peace Joseph Scott. She was subsequently released on personal recognizance.

4. **Misdemeanor - Possession of Alcohol by Underage Person:** On Sunday, March 12, 2017 at approximately 8:36 PM, Patrolman Michael Jacome and Corporal William Litterio arrested **Dalton L. Stein**, age 18, of 530 Lake Road, Andover, CT on a charge of **Possession of Alcoholic Beverage by an Underage Person** after Off. Jacome stopped a vehicle for twice traveling over the white fog line of Kingstown Road, which revealed an open container of alcohol and several 12-ounce cans of beer and Twisted Tea, along with a small amount of marijuana (less than one ounce). Mr. Stein was released with a summons to appear in 4th District Court for arraignment on the above charge.
5. **Misdemeanor - Possession of Alcohol by Underage Person:** On Sunday, March 12, 2017 at approximately 8:36 PM, Patrolman Michael Jacome and Corporal William Litterio arrested **Michael Saltus**, age 18, of 56 East Street, Hebron, CT on a charge of **Possession of Alcoholic Beverage by an Underage Person** after Off. Jacome stopped a vehicle for twice traveling over the white fog line of Kingstown Road, which revealed an open container of alcohol and several 12-ounce cans of beer and Twisted Tea. Mr. Saltus was released with a summons to appear in 4th District Court for arraignment on the above charge.
6. **Misdemeanor - DUI (1st offense - BAC unknown), and Chemical Test Refusal:** On Tuesday, March 14, 2017 at approximately 6:35 PM, Patrolmen Anthony Zoglio and Ryan Donohue arrested **John Haxton**, age 48, of 51 Oakland Road, Richmond on a charge of (1) **Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol and/ or Drugs (1st offense - BAC unknown)**, and (2) **Refusal to Submit to a Chemical Test (civil)**, after officers were dispatched to a motor vehicle accident involving one vehicle (a pickup truck) crashing into a tree near 126 Old Mountain Trail. Mr. Haxton was arrested on suspicion of DUI after performing a series of standard field sobriety tests. He was processed at the station, where he refused to consent to a chemical test. Mr. Haxton was arraigned before Justice of the Peace James Callaghan, and was released on \$2,000 personal recognizance.
