PRESS RELEASE - March 22, 2017

1. **Misdemeanor - Possession of Alcohol by Underage Person:** On Friday, March 16, 2017 at approximately 9:03 PM, Patrolman Michael Jacome and Corporal William Litterio arrested **Liza J. Tabshey**, age 19, of 111 Gorski Drive, South Windsor, CT on a charge of **Possession of Alcoholic Beverage by an Underage Person** after Off. Jacome stopped a vehicle for speeding at **65-MPH** in a posted 45-MPH zone on Nooseneck Hill Road. The stop revealed that the two teenage occupants had three bottles of hard liquor in the vehicle. The operator was processed at the station and was released with a summons to appear in 4th District Court for arraignment on the above charge.
2. **Misdemeanor - DUI (1st offense - BAC .10 - .15):** On Thursday, March 16, 2017 at approximately 9:56 PM, Corporal William Litterio and Patrolman Michael Jacome arrested **Franklin T. Recchia**, age 44, of 29 Arcadia Road, Apt. A, Hopkinton on a charge of **Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol and/ or Drugs (1st offense - BAC .10-.15)**, after Cpl. Litterio stopped Mr. Recchia's vehicle for crossing over the double yellow center line of Route 112. He was arrested on suspicion of DUI after performing a series of standard field sobriety tests. He submitted to a Breathalyzer test that resulted in BAC (blood-alcohol-content) readings of **.141 (1st phase)**, and **.135 (2nd phase)**. Mr. Recchia was processed at the station and was released with a summons to appear in 4th District Court for arraignment on the above DUI charge.
3. **FELONY - Possession of a Synthetic Drug (Butane Hash Oil) & Misdemeanor - DUI (1st offense - BAC .08-.10):** On Friday, March 17, 2017 at approximately 9:14 PM, Corporal William Litterio and Patrolman Andy Briody arrested **Gregory M. Carroll**, age 36, of 180 North Road, South Kingstown on charges of (1) **Possession of a Synthetic Drug (Butane Hash Oil)**, and (2) **Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol and/ or Drugs (1st offense - BAC .08-.10)**, after Corporal Litterio stopped Mr. Carroll for speeding on Route 138. Mr. Carroll was arrested on suspicion of DUI after performing a series of standard field sobriety tests. Incident to his arrest, officers located a small bag of "marijuana paste" on Mr. Carroll's person, along with a small amount of dried marijuana (less than one ounce) and marijuana edibles (cookies). He submitted to a Breathalyzer test that resulted in BAC (blood-alcohol-content) readings of **.083 (1st phase)**, and **.078 (2nd phase)**. He was processed at the station and was arraigned before Justice of the Peace James Callaghan, and was released on \$2,000 personal recognizance.

4. **Misdemeanor - Possession of Alcohol by Underage Person:** On Saturday, March 18, 2017 at approximately 4:59 PM, Corporal William Litterio arrested **Jake T. Lembo**, age 18, of 15 D Lauri Drive, Charlestown on a charge of **Possession of Alcoholic Beverage by an Underage Person** after stopping his unregistered vehicle on Shannock Hill Road, which revealed a full “nip” bottle of liquor and an empty alcoholic beverage container in the passenger’s compartment. The operator was released with a summons to appear in 4th District Court for arraignment on the above charge.
5. **Misdemeanor - Operating on Suspended License (3rd Offense or more):** On Sunday, March 18, 2017, at 4:54, Patrolman Ryan Donohue arrested **Larry C. Robinson**, age 39, of 2190 Kingstown Road on a charge of **Operating on a Suspended License (3rd suspended license violation)**, after a motor vehicle stop for speeding on Kingstown Road revealed that Mr. Robinson’s license had been suspended multiple times for *Child Support Non-Payment*, and he had been charged six (6) previous times with driving on a suspended license. Mr. Robinson was processed at the station, and was released with a summons to appear in 4th District Court on April 20th, 2017, for arraignment.
6. **Misdemeanor - Crank or Obscene Phone Calls:** On Saturday, March 18, 2017 at approximately 9:14 PM, Corporal William Litterio received custody of **Gregory M. Carroll**, age 36, of 180 North Road, South Kingstown from the South Kingstown Police Department after they arrested him on the strength of the Richmond Police Department’s arrest warrant charging him **Crank or Obscene Phone Calls**. The day after the Richmond Police Department arrested him for driving impaired, Mr. Carroll repeatedly called the Richmond Police Department and used profane, vulgar and obscene language while speaking with male and female civilian dispatchers, and police officers. Mr. Carroll was returned to the Richmond Police Department and was processed. He was arraigned before Justice of the Peace James Callaghan, and was released on \$2,000 personal recognizance.
7. **FELONY - Possession of a Schedule I Controlled Substance (Butane Hash Oil):** On Sunday, March 19, 2017 at approximately 9:37 PM, Corporal William Litterio arrested **Darin R. Thibeault**, age 19, of 3140 South County Trail, South Kingstown on a charges of **Possession of a Schedule I Controlled Substance (Butane Hash Oil)**, after Corporal Litterio observed a vehicle stopped on Switch Road with an interior light on suddenly accelerate and turn abruptly onto Pine Hill Road. A motor vehicle stop resulted in the seizure of a small container of Butane Hash Oil (BHO), and a glass smoking pipe containing residue of BHO. Mr. Thibeault was processed at the station and was arraigned before Justice of the Peace James Callaghan. He was released on \$2,000 personal recognizance.

8. **FELONY - Possession of a Controlled Substance (Tramadol HCL):** On Tuesday, March 21, 2017 at approximately 1:28 AM, Patrolmen Michael Jacome and Ryan Donohue arrested **Jose A. Ledee**, age 19, of 55 Arnold Street, Apt. 13, Woonsocket on a charge of **Possession of a Controlled Substance (60 pills of Tramadol HCL)** after Patrolman Jacome stopped a vehicle on Route 95 Northbound for speeding at **90-MPH in a posted 65-MPH-zone**. The stop revealed a small amount of marijuana (less than an ounce) and two (2) pill containers with prescription labels that had been partially torn away to omit the name of the person to whom the prescription belonged. Mr. Ledee was processed at the station, and was arraigned before Justice of the Peace Michael Robinson. He was subsequently released on \$5,000 personal recognizance.
