PRESS RELEASE – November 8, 2017

1. **Wayward Juvenile – Disorderly Conduct:** On Wednesday, October 25th, 2017 at approximately 2:25 PM, School Resource Officer (SRO) Anthony Zoglio, Lieutenant John Arnold, and Officer Jeffrey Vaughn arrested a **16-year-old female student** at Chariho High School on a charge of **Disorderly Conduct**, after officers were dispatched to assist the SRO and an administrative dean in controlling a combative youth who punched a staff member in the face and actively resisted efforts to be restrained, by punching, kicking, and spitting at police officers and the dean. Her actions led to a minor injury to a staff member, and minor damage to school property. She was eventually subdued, and was transported to South County Hospital for an evaluation. She shall be referred to Family Court on the above charge and resource referral.
2. **FELONY: Possession of a Stolen Motor Vehicle & Possession of a Controlled Substance (Crack Cocaine):** On Monday, November 6th, 2017 at approximately 1:00 AM, Patrolman Brock Taylor and Sergeant William Litterio arrested **Ray Glaspie**, age 58, of 33 Meadow Street, Mystic, CT on felony charges of 1) **Possession of a Stolen Motor Vehicle**, and 2) **Possession of a Controlled Substance (Crack Cocaine)**. Patrolman Taylor was conducting a routine business check at the McDonald's restaurant in Wyoming after closing, and located a suspicious vehicle in the parking lot with two occupants inside. He checked the Connecticut registration and learned that the vehicle had been reported stolen out of Groton, CT, on November 3rd. Officers found the occupants in possession of drug paraphernalia and a small amount of crack cocaine. Mr. Glaspie was processed at the station and held overnight for arraignment in 4th District Court later that morning on the above charges.
3. **FELONY: Possession of a Controlled Substance (Crack Cocaine):** On Monday, November 6th, 2017 at approximately 1:00 AM, Patrolman Brock Taylor and Sergeant William Litterio arrested **Eliza L. Matteson**, age 24, of no permanent address, on felony charges of **Possession of a Controlled Substance (Crack Cocaine)**. Patrolman Taylor was conducting a routine business check at the McDonald's restaurant in Wyoming after closing, and located a suspicious vehicle in the parking lot with two occupants inside. He checked the Connecticut registration and learned that the vehicle had been reported stolen out of Groton, CT, on November 3rd. Officers found the occupants in possession of drug paraphernalia and a small amount of crack cocaine. Ms. Matteson was processed at the station and was released with a summons to appear for arraignment in 4th District Court at a later date.

4. **Misdemeanor - Violation of a No-Contact Order:** On Monday, November 6, 2017 at 8:30 PM Sergeant Michael Lawing arrested **Michele Black**, age 53, formerly of 23 Foster Farm Road, Richmond on a charge of **Violation of a No-Contact Order** after officers were dispatched to the above address for an alleged domestic disturbance in progress. Upon arrival, Sergeant Lawing discovered Ms. Black in the company of a “protected person” named in a no-contact that had been issued by the 4th District Court on 10/30/2017. She was arrested without incident and was processed at the station. She was arraigned before Justice of the Peace Michael Robinson, and was released on recognizance pending re-arraignment before the 4th District Court on Thursday, November 9, 2017. The no-contact order remained in full effect.
